John is very bright (and knows it), and works hard to ask and answer questions carefully and intellectually. I enjoy our conversations, but am trying to focus less on intellectual sparring, and more on Gospel truth. I'm sure I will see him again. Pray God gives me wisdom in our upcoming conversations.

John in Downtown San Jose – I met John (in the red jacket) on one of our San Jose trips. He started out argumentative, but softened when I responded politely, and we had a great talk. He is a very devout Roman Catholic, and knew their theology well. However, he didn't know scripture as well, and had to really stretch the meaning of the verses I gave him to make them fit his beliefs. He was getting ready to go out of town, but took my number and said we should get together when he got back. Pray that happens. Ben and DeJon in Oakland – Ben and DeJon both stopped to watch one of my sketches (during which I talked to a very verbally aggressive young man), and both stayed to talk for a long time afterwards. Ben talked with Steve (lower right), and DeJon spoke with Tim and I. Both conversations were very fruitful, and I think God was really working. Please pray that Ben, an Agnostic, and DeJon, who has a spiritual background & seems to be searching, come to Christ.

OAC Director's Conference:

At the end of September, I got the opportunity to travel to Boston and spend a week with other Open Air Campaigners evangelists at our bi-yearly Directors Conference. Last year was our all staff conference, which I wasn't able to attend due to some personal issues going on, so I was very excited to go this year. It's amazing to spend time with so many Godly men, several of whom have been in ministry work for decades. The three members of our management staff alone have more than 100 years of combined ministry experience. It's a

huge privilege to be able to work with, and get advice from them, and the others there as well. We spent time in fellowship, in prayer, hearing reports from our branches around the country, and in discussing new challenges to and opportunities for the work. I was very encouraged to talk about outreach techniques in area where using the sketchboard is difficult, and in hearing reports from one of our directors on openings in public high schools. He works will student-run lunch-alternative Christian clubs in many high schools, and is so busy he has a waiting list! At the end of the week a group of us were able to help a local church in Plymouth pioneer a kids Bible club at a local housing project (below). It was very encouraging to me, and reminded me of how much I'd like to start similar clubs in our area. That is starting to move along finally, but more on that later!

Witnessing Tip – BE FLEXIBLE!

As mentioned above, one of the things we talked about at our Directors Conference was outreach options for areas where our sketchboards don't work as well. We discussed banners, object lessons, and other options. The bottom line is not the method, but doing all we can to share the Gospel in the public square. "Our ministry moto, Presenting Christ by all means, everywhere!", captures it well.



So my question is, what means are you using? Gospel tracts? Open-air preaching? One-on-one conversations? Do you wait for people to ask you about Christ, or are you intentional about finding and making opportunities for Gospel conversations? Whatever you are doing, I'd encourage you to try something new. Don't get stuck in a rut. Be creative, and see what God does.
